



She is a graduate of Brandeis University and she holds a 1982 M.A. in conservation of works of art and historic buildings from NYU's Institute of Fine Arts. Her work revolves around restoring historic places and artworks, and she writes about the importance of materials to defining place in her books Tropicana Nights: The Life and Times of the Legendary Cuban Nightclub (Harcourt, 2005) and Promising Paradise: Cuban Allure American Seduction (Wolfsonian Museum). Rosa has founded numerous conservation studios, including RLA Conservation, LLC, where she currently works.




